

DWI Enforcement Kicks Off

Our next Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) enforcement wave will kick off Wednesday, November 22nd. The enhanced enforcement continues through December 31, and will focus on DWIs. Our officers will be working cooperatively with others from Northfield PD, Rice County Sheriff's Office, and the Minnesota State Patrol to help keep impaired drivers off the roads throughout the county. Domestic Assault Arrest

On Tuesday, November 21, **Officers Michael Shuda, Ben Johns, Sean Smallen and Karl Willers** responded to a 911 hangup. On arrival, they met with a male subject who stated “his old lady” probably called, and denied any physical altercation. The officers checked with a female subject in the residence who was breathing heavily and stated the male, who was her boyfriend, had been strangling her. She stated he was intoxicated and had been trying to wake her up. He

became upset with her and put both of his hands on her neck and cut off her breathing. The officers also observed bruising which the victim stated had resulted from previous assaults. The male, John Adkisson, 33, provided a breath sample of .23 BAC. He was arrested and jailed. He was charged with Domestic Assault by Strangulation and Domestic Assault - Gross Misdemeanor (two counts). His bail was set at \$15,000 with conditions.

Thanksgiving Safety

Thanksgiving is this week. Our friends at the Faribault Fire Department ask us to share the following safety messages so they don't become inadvertent guests at your meal.

As you plan your Thanksgiving menu don't forget about fire safety.

Did you know Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires? The number of home fires double on Thanksgiving. So, let's add a pinch of fire safety to the menu. Keep these safety tips in mind as you prepare your meal.

Turkey: If you are roasting your turkey, make sure you set a timer. This way, you won't forget about

the bird as you watch the parade or football.

If you are frying your turkey, remember:

- Use a fryer with thermostat controls. This will ensure the oil does not become over heated.
- Thaw your turkey completely. Ice on the bird will cause the oil to splatter.
- Don't overfill the pot with oil. If you do, the oil will overflow when you add the turkey causing a fire hazard.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the fryer.
- Also, always use the fryer outdoors.

Potatoes and Stuffing: Stand by your stove when you

are boiling your potatoes or frying onions for stuffing. It is best to stay in the kitchen when you are frying, boiling or broiling. If you are in the kitchen, it is easier to catch spills or hazardous conditions before they become a fire.

- Keep the area around the stove clear of packaging, paper towels, and dish cloths; anything that can burn.
- Be sure to clean up any spills as they happen.
- Be prepared. Keep a large pan lid or baking sheet handy in case you need to smother a pan fire.
- Turn pot handles towards the back of the stove so you don't bump them.
