Assault Arrest

On Tuesday, September 4th, **Officers Sean Smallen, Scott Duncan and Sergeant Mark Krenik** responded to a reported assault and robbery at a residence. On arrival, officers encountered two male victims. The first male reported he had been struck in the head by a male holding a handgun. The second male reported his apartment door had been kicked in and he was assaulted by a male holding a knife and a gun. The description of the suspect provided to officers matched the description of a male they had encountered earlier in the evening. **Officers Keith Voegel, Cadie Spicer and Chris Tonjum** also arrived to


assist, and **Detectives Josh Alexander, Matt Shuda and Sergeant Matt Long** responded to investigate. Surveillance video at the apartment showed a male matching the suspect's description leaving with a TV, and officers found video of the suspect on social media wearing the same clothing as the victims described. An alert was issued to surrounding agencies, and the suspect, Justice Tryon, 21, was stopped a short time later by Burnsville PD. A gun was recovered from his vehicle. He was arrested and transported to Faribault. In a post-Miranda statement, Tryon admitted to the assault, burglary and theft. He was charged with

1st degree Burglary (three counts) and 2nd degree Assault (two counts). His bail was set at \$100,000 with conditions.



New Officer to Start

This week, **Officer Jacob Holm** began training for his new duties as a patrol officer. He has been working as one of our Reserve Officers and part-time CSOs for the past 23 months. A graduate of Medford High School, Ofc. Holm obtained his bachelor's degree from Minnesota State University - Mankato. Ofc. Holm will be sworn in at the City Council meeting on Tuesday, September 11th. We look forward to working with Jacob in his new role.



Domestic Assault Arrest

On Sunday, September 2nd, **Officers Sean Smallen, Sarah Tollefson and Scott Duncan** responded to a reported medical. On arrival, they found a female victim unconscious outside of a residence. Witnesses stated she had been running around and ran into a tree, knocking herself out. She was transported to District One Hospital and then airlifted to a metro-area hospital. Ofc. Smallen received a call from the victim the next day, who stated she had been arguing with her boyfriend, and

he had pushed her down. She reported she did not remember anything after being pushed, and hospital staff stated she had a head injury. She denied the incident was an accident. Ofc. Smallen attempted to locate the suspect, Brian Masso, 37, and issued an alert to surrounding agencies, where he was located and arrested. Masso was charged with 3rd degree Assault and Domestic Assault. His bail was set at \$10,000 with conditions.



The scams continue. This week, scammers are trying to take advantage of our Rice County partners. Citizens have been receiving phone calls from “Lieutenant Reed” of the Rice County Sheriff’s Office, advising

them that they missed jury duty and threatening them with arrest.

While the Sheriff’s Office does not have a “Lieutenant Reed”, they will never call you threat-

ening to arrest you for missing jury duty or attempting to get you to pay money to avoid arrest.
