

Three In One

On Tuesday, February 26th, agents of the **Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force** observed a man driving whom they recognized and knew to be the subject of an arrest warrant. They stopped the vehicle, and RCSO **Deputy Aaron Snyder** arrived to assist. They confirmed the driver to be Brady Wright, 26, and he was arrested pursuant to his warrants. The agents also recognized Wright's passenger as Derek Schmidtke, 21. The agents had probable cause to arrest Schmidtke from two previous drug investigations. **Officers John Pesta** and **Cadie Spicer** arrived to assist

with the arrest. At the jail, Schmidtke was found to be in possession of a drug pipe concealed in his pants cuff, and the pipe contained apparent marijuana wax. Schmidtke was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances and Introducing Contraband into a Jail. He was also charged with 3rd degree Controlled Substances - Sales resulting from a sale of 3.5 grams of methamphetamine on January 4th, and 5th degree Controlled Substances resulting from an earlier traffic stop. His bail was set at \$5,000 with conditions in all three cases.



Applications Open

The City of Faribault is accepting applications for a Police Officer. Applicants must be POST eligible by the time of an offer and the process is to establish an eligibility list of quality candidates. The department has one immediate opening to replace an officer leaving for another jurisdiction. Law enforcement students who will be done with school by the end of 2019 are encouraged to apply. Applicants must submit a letter of interest, resume and complete City application packet with supplemental questionnaire to be eligible.




Domestic Assault Arrest

On Thursday, February 21st, **Sergeant Brandon Gliem** met with a man at the police department. He reported that his adult son had assaulted him a short time earlier. Sgt. Gliem could see redness across the victim's face. The victim explained that his son wanted to take the victim's car, but was told no as the suspect did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect then wanted money and a ride, and when told no, slapped the victim in the face. The victim then began



driving away out of fear for his safety, as he had been assaulted by the suspect before. Sgt. Gliem, accompanied by **Officers Karl Willers, Michael Shuda and Bill Considine** found the suspect, Austin Beytien, 19, at his residence. Beytien denied assaulting his father. Beytien was arrested and jailed. He was charged with Domestic Assault - felony, and was released on his own recognizance by the court.
