DANCO Arrest

On Saturday, June 15th, **Officers Tony Larson, Tony Kuchinka** and **Sergeant Matt Knutson** responded to a reported domestic assault and DANCO violation. The victim reported she was at home when the suspect came to the residence, made threats to kill her, assaulted her, and took her phone. She stated he followed her to a second residence when she attempted to flee him. As officers arrived, the suspect, Francisco Davila, 35, ran from the area. **Sergeant Trevor Peterson** and **K9 Scout** assisted in searching the area and found Davila hiding in a hay field. He was taken into custody without incident. In a post-Miranda interview, Davila acknowledged that a Domestic Abuse No Contact Order

(DANCO) was in place, but the protected party was not at home, he did not have contact with her, and he only came to the residence to retrieve a vehicle. Officers interviewed several witnesses who corroborated the victim's report. Davila was jailed and charged with 1st degree Burglary (four counts), Witness Tampering, 2nd degree Assault, False Imprisonment, Domestic Assault by Strangulation, Terroristic Threats, and DANCO Violation. His bail was set at \$200,000 with conditions.

Detective Brittany Carstensen subsequently reviewed recorded phone calls made by Davila to the victim while he was in custody. Davila apologized to the victim, and then threatened her, and told her to

make arrangements for bail money. One of the calls was made less than one hour after being served a second DANCO in court. Davila was then charged with DANCO Violation (three counts). His bail in the second case was set at \$10,000 with no conditions.

OFF Violation

On Tuesday, June 18th, **Officer Chris Tonjum** spoke with a victim reporting an Order for Protection (OFF) violation. She stated the suspect, Shannon Tonn, 39, had been sending her numerous text messages over the past month. She reported she believed Tonn was spoofing his phone number, as the messages came from different unidentified numbers. She showed Ofc. Tonjum a threat of messages dated June 7, which did come from Tonn’s phone number.

Tonn referenced being pursued by police, and Ofc. Tonjum knew that Tonn had been involved in a pursuit that day. Ofc. Tonjum, **Detective Brittany Carstensen** and **Sergeant Matt Long** went to Tonn’s residence and saw him sitting outside. Tonn ran into the residence. Another female present opened the door for officers, who took Tonn into custody without incident. Tonn was cited for OFF Violation, his fourth charge in two months, and his

bail was set at \$3,500 with conditions.

Domestic Assault Arrest

On Wednesday, June 19th, **Officers Josh Alexander** and **Bill Considine** responded to a reported domestic assault. Ofc. Alexander spoke with a woman who reported her four children were at home while she was at work. One of the children reported that a man who lives in the same residence assaulted her. She reported he strangled her and pushed her several times, yelling that she needed to learn a lesson. Ofc. Alexander could see red marks on the



victim’s neck. The other children reported seeing the assault. They were scared and ran to their mother’s workplace for help. Ofc. Considine met with the suspect, Duane Randall, 57, who stated he had been attacked by one of the children and denied any assault. Randall was arrested and cited for Domestic Assault. He was released on his own recognition by the court.
