Left Lane Law

On August 1st, a pair of new traffic laws go into effect - the hands free law was covered last week - and the left lane (or slowpoke) law.

The new law says that when practicable, drivers need to move out of the left lane and allow vehicles to pass. Accord-

ing to Colonel Matt Langer of the Minnesota State Patrol:

- the new law modernizes existing language related to lane use.
- nothing in the law allows drivers to speed.
- one good way to prevent road

rage and to drive with reduced stress is to simply move over and allow others to go around.

- traffic moves most efficiently when everyone is travelling at about the same speed, which cannot be above the posted limit or faster than conditions allow.



Monthly Activity

On Friday, July 12th, Officer Bill Considine checked the registration of a vehicle parked at a local gas station. He learned that the vehicle was listed as stolen. **Officer Scott Duncan, Sergeant Eric Sammon, RCSO Deputies Steve Bauer, Dan Berndtson and Mac Malecha** responded to assist. Ofc. Considine saw three



people get into the vehicle, and the officers stopped it before it left and detained the occupants. The driver, Derek Tolbert, 30, told Ofc. Considine that he had just purchased the vehicle and transferred the title days earlier and did not know why it was reported as stolen. He could not provide a name of the person who sold it to him. Officers found a glass methamphetamine pipe with residue in Tolbert’s pocket. Officers also found paraphernalia with methamphetamine residue in a passenger’s backpack. Tolbert and one passenger, Lekeisha Hofbauer, 32, were arrested and jailed. The other passenger was released from the scene. **Detective Brittany Carstensen** discovered that the vehicle’s actual owner had left the title in the glove box, and Tolbert had

forged his signature to transfer the title to himself. Tolbert was charged with Receiving Stolen Property and 5th degree Controlled Substances. His bail was set at \$10,000 with conditions. Hofbauer was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, and her bail was set at \$20,000 with conditions.
