## Crisis Intervention Training

This week, seven of our officers, along with other public safety personnel from Northfield, Dundas, and Lonsdale PD, Rice County SO, St. Olaf and Carleton College Security, Northfield EMS and Dakota County attended a 40-hour

Crisis Intervention Training course. We consider this training to be the gold standard for dealing with people in crisis. This course also fulfills new POST Board training requirements in crisis intervention, mental health, conflict manage-

ment, implicit bias, community diversity and cultural differences. We are grateful for the work of the Rice County Chemical and Mental Health Coalition to obtain grant funding and hosting this course in Faribault.



Our officers will be conducting extra patrols for the current TZD enforcement wave. Officers, deputies and troopers statewide will be on the lookout for seatbelt violations. Although Minnesota drivers have a 93% compliance rate, increased seatbelt and child car seat usage would further decrease serious injuries and deaths. The current

enforcement wave will be conducted through September 28th.

Richards is 5'8" tall, weighs 108 pounds, has brown eyes and black hair.

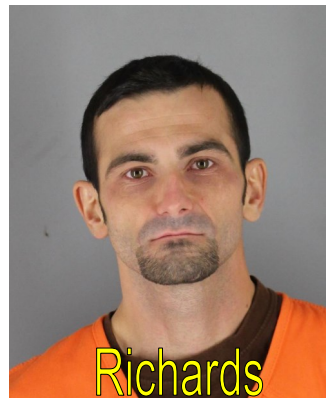
