## Domestic Assault Arrest

On Tuesday, December 10th, **Officers Spencer Angle** and **Chris Tonjum** responded to a reported domestic assault. The caller told dispatch that her co-worker was badly bruised and had stated her boyfriend had beaten her up. The victim stated she and the suspect had been arguing about moving out, and he hit her several times with his closed fists, and remembered being thrown into a wall. The victim

was taken to Allina-District One Hospital for medical attention. The officers located the suspect, **Dammon Nailon**, 38, at his residence. He was arrested and transported to jail. He was charged with two counts of Domestic Assault (felony), and his bail was set at \$20,000 with conditions.
