## Welcome Aboard

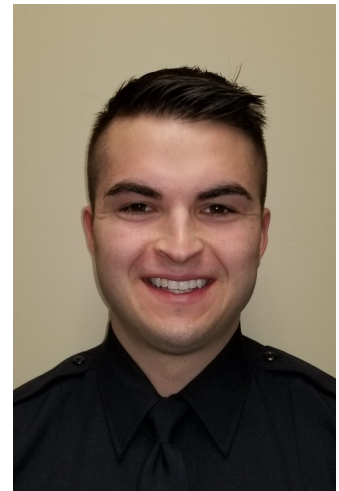
On Wednesday, two new officers joined our ranks, filling vacancies created by officers who left us for other agencies.

## Domestic Assault Arrest

On Monday, January 27th, Officers **Sarah Tollefson, Josh Alexander, Bill Considine, Scott Duncan, and Sergeant Mark Krenik** responded to a disturbance call. En route, dispatchers informed the officers that the caller reported her boyfriend had broken her car window and was punching her. On arrival, officers met with the victim and witnesses. The victim stated the suspect, Timothy Handy, 31, was drunk when he broke her car window



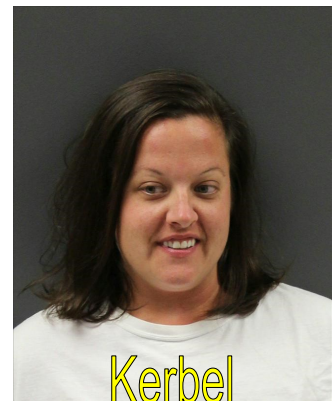
and began punching her. One of the witnesses stepped in and fought with Handy to stop him. Handy was arrested and jailed. He was charged with Domestic Assault - felony (two counts) and Damage to Property. His bail was set at \$30,000 with conditions.

Coincidentally, Handy was just sentenced on January 3rd for Domestic Assault - gross misdemeanor.

## Theft Arrest

On Friday, January 24th, **Officer Adam Marvin** took a report of a stolen purse. The victim told Ofc. Marvin she had checked with her bank, and someone had attempted to use her bank card earlier in the day. The victim told Ofc. Marvin she suspected her roommate had taken the purse. While conducting further investigation, the suspect came to the police department. The suspect, Melissa Kerbel, 39, denied to Ofc. Marvin that she had taken the purse, and stated she had also had a vacuum cleaner taken from her room in an attempt to deflect suspicion from herself.

While Ofc. Marvin was inside the building, **Officer Ben Borash** told him that he saw Kerbel across the street running through the parking lot with several garbage bags. When he stopped her, Kerbel told Ofc. Marvin that she was cleaning out her car. Ofc. Marvin looked in one of the garbage bags and saw the victim's purse. Kerbel was arrested. Inside her car, Ofc. Marvin found the vacuum cleaner Kerbel had reported as stolen. Kerbel was charged with Theft, Obstructing Legal Process, Falsely Reporting a Crime, and Possession of a Stolen or



Counterfeit Check. She was released on her own recognizance by the court.
