

Argument Leads to Assault

On Sunday, March 20th, **Officers Keith Voegel, Mallory House and Sergeant Mark Krenik** were dispatched to a reported assault. The victim stated she had been arguing with the suspect, with whom she has a child. She also stated the suspect now worked as her Personal Care Assistant (PCA). She stated the suspect was angry, called her names and pushed her down. A witness

who was present also told officers that he witnessed the suspect, James Mallon, 23, push the victim. Mallon was arrested and charged with Domestic Assault and Criminal Abuse of a Vulnerable Adult. His bail was set at \$1,000 with conditions.



Training Update

Fire Chief Dustin Dienst and Police Chief Andy Bohlen recently attended a two day FEMA Incident Command System course in Grand Rapids, MN. The final course, entitled ICS-400, rounded out a series of certifications and provided command and general staff training on management and coordination of complex multi-jurisdictional emergency incidents. It provided a framework

and will better prepare City staff for dealing with emergency incidents within the City of Faribault.

Detective Scott Duncan recently attended Forensic Partners training, presented by the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension and the Hennepin County Medical examiner. The course provides in-depth training in death investigation and includes

three days of autopsy observation.

Officers John Gramling and DJ Skluzacek attended a certification course to operate the DMT-G breath testing instrument, which is used to measure breath samples of suspected intoxicated drivers.

Health Fair

On Friday, March 18th, **CSO Supervisor Doug Delesha** represented the department at the Shattuck-St. Mary's Health Fair. He met with and presented information to about 300 students and staff in attendance.

Don't Tread On Me



Domestic Assault Arrest

On Tuesday, March 22nd, **Officers Chris Tonjum, John Pesta, Tom Mueller, Lisa Petricka and Sergeant Eric Sammon** responded to a reported domestic assault. On arrival, the officers saw a woman leaving the residence who appeared to be scared. She told the officers she did not want “him” to see her speaking with the officers. The officers identified a male at the residence and learned he was the subject of two arrest warrants and placed him under arrest. The woman

eventually told the officers that the suspect, Heriberto Cancino-Magana, 31, had been at her residence for about three weeks and refused to leave. He also threatened the lives of her and her children and prevented her from contacting anyone. When she attempted to call for help, he took the phone away from her. Cancino-Magana was jailed and charged with Domestic Assault and Terroristic Threats. His bail was set at \$20,000 with conditions.

We want to warn residents to watch out this weekend for a home invasion suspect. However, this one is careless, does not cover his tracks and leaves plenty of evidence to show where he has struck. There have been multiple descriptions given by witnesses, but they all have commonalities. The suspect has larger than normal ears, large front teeth and is covered in fur. itself in an attempt to taunt authorities. We ask that residents not approach the suspect, but to call an officer for forensic tasting, er, testing of
