Search Warrant Arrest

On Friday, May 20th, agents of the **Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force** executed a search warrant at a Faribault residence in connection to a narcotics investigation. The agents were assisted by **Sergeants Brandon Gliem and Matt Knutson, Detective Scott Duncan and Officer Lisa Petricka**. Inside the residence, agents seized 194 grams of marijuana. They also seized a small quantity of marijuana wax, a bag of marijuana edibles, items indicating narcotics sales and a BB gun replica of

a rifle. The suspect, Timothy Kuntze, 34, was arrested and jailed. Three children in the residence were placed with relatives with the assistance of Social Services. Kuntze was charged with three counts of 5th degree Controlled Substances and Possession of a Firearm by a Prohibited Person. He was released on his own recognizance.

Saved by the Belt

On Tuesday, May 24th, **Chief Andy Bohlen** and **Sheriff Troy Dunn** presented **Captain Neal Pederson** with a Saved by the Belt Award. Capt. Pederson was involved in a crash on July 13, 2015, and use

of his seatbelt prevented serious injuries. Also speaking during the presentation was State Patrol **Sergeant Troy Christianson**, Safe Roads Coordinator **Kathy Cooper** and Office of Traffic Safety Liaison **Scott**

McConkey. Capt. Pederson's experience is a stark reminder that no one is immune to hazards on the road and buckling up is the key to preventing serious injuries or death.



Click It or Ticket

Officers are currently conducting extra seatbelt enforcement May 23rd through June 5th. They will also be on the look-out for speeding, DWI and distracted driving violations. Please do your part to help keep our streets safe for everyone by buckling up and driving safely.

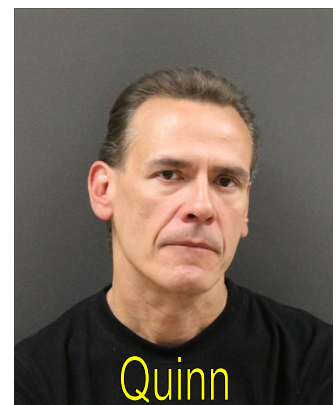
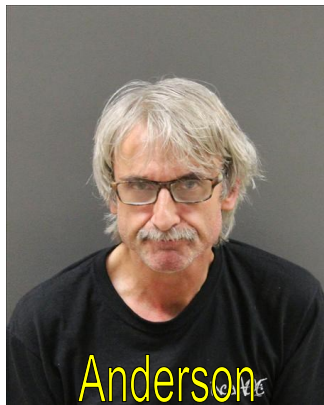

Traffic Stop Turns Up More

On Thursday, May 26th, **Officer Said Hilowle** stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. In speaking with the vehicle occupants, he noted one of the passengers was sitting on the console between the front seats. **Officer Mallory House** arrived to assist, and could see drug paraphernalia in plain view inside the vehicle. **Sergeant**

Eric Sammon also arrived to assist, and the occupants were removed from the vehicle. Officers found a methamphetamine pipe with residue, several small baggies containing methamphetamine residue, syringes and a small scale. The driver, David Anderson, 58, and one of the passengers, Kevin Quinn, 50, were arrested and jailed. Anderson was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances and Possession of Hypodermic Needles, and released on his own recognizance. Quinn was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and was also released on his own recognizance.
