Warrant Arrest Leads to More

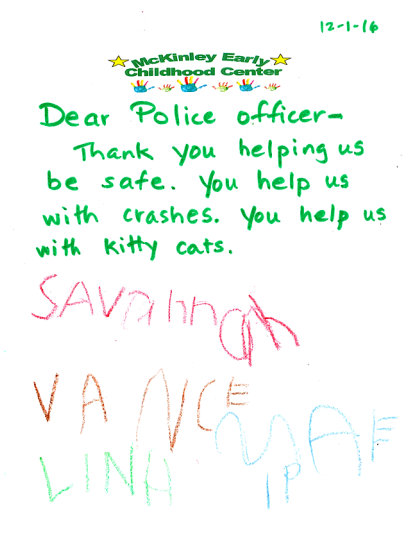
On Wednesday, January 11th, officers were searching for Abdiiaz Adan, 26, to arrest him for an outstanding warrant for Criminal Sexual Conduct. The officers received information that Adan was staying at a local motel and subsequently located him there. He was arrested and searched, and officers found a baggie containing marijuana in his jacket. He was transported to jail. While being processed, correctional deputies observed what appeared to be a baggie

containing controlled substances fall out of his underwear. Adan admitted the baggie was “dope”, and officers confirmed the baggie contained three grams of cocaine. In addition to his charges of 1st degree Criminal Sexual Conduct, Adan was also charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, Introducing Contraband into Jail, and Possession of Small Amount of Marijuana. His bail on both cases was set at \$250,000 with conditions.

OFF Violation

On Monday, January 9th, **Officer Adam Marvin** responded to a 911 hangup. Later that morning, we were notified that Steele County had located and arrested Prestegard, who was transported to jail. He was cited for Violation of OFF, and released by the court on his own recognizance.
