Meth Arrest

On Wednesday, September 6th, Officer Karl Willers and Michael Shuda observed a vehicle known to belong to Nam Srey, 36. The officers were aware that Srey's driver's license was suspended, and methamphetamine had been found in the vehicle during a recent traffic stop. As they followed the vehicle, the driver made several quick turns to evade the officers and then parked in front of Srey's residence. The officers met with Srey, who admitted he knew he should not be driving. Srey also admitted to throwing a glass

methamphetamine pipe out of the vehicle so the officers wouldn't find it. In searching the vehicle, the officers found several baggies of suspected methamphetamine and another pipe in the vehicle. Srey was arrested. He was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Driving After Suspension. His bail was set at \$10,000 with conditions, in connection with a second case charging him 5th degree Controlled Substances (two counts) from a separate incident.

In addition, **CSO Jacob Holm**, who has been working as a summer CSO, will be continuing on as a part-time CSO while he is also attending school for law enforcement.



DWI Arrest

On Friday, September 1st, Officer Mallory House responded to a report of an unconscious person in a motor vehicle. When she arrived, she saw the suspect vehicle leaving the area without its headlights on. She caught up with the vehicle and saw it stop and then proceed through a red light. She stopped the vehicle and met with the driver, who displayed signs of intoxication. The driver, Candelario Valen-



cia, 66, submitted to and failed several field sobriety tests and was arrested. At the jail, he failed to provide an adequate breath sample for testing. He was charged with 2nd degree DWI, Refuse to Test, Failure to Use Headlights and Failure to Obey a Traffic Signal. He was released by the court on his own recognizance.
