### **Faribault Police Department's K9 Cannon has received body armor**

FARIBAULT - Faribault Police Department's K9 Cannon has received a bullet and stab protective vest thanks to a charitable donation from non-profit organization Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. The vest was sponsored by an Anonymous Sponsor and embroidered with the sentiment "In memory of K9 Major, Roseville, MN Police Department".

Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. is a 501c(3) charity located in East Taunton, MA whose mission is to provide bullet and stab protective vests and other assistance to dogs of law enforcement and related agencies throughout the United States. The non-profit was established in 2009 to assist law enforcement agencies with this potentially lifesaving body armor for their four-legged K9 officers. Since its inception, Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. provided over 2,800 protective vests in 50 states, through private and corporate donations, at a cost of over 2.4 million dollars.

The program is open to dogs actively employed in the U.S. with law enforcement or related agencies who are certified and at least 20 months of age. New K9 graduates, as well as K9s with expired vests, are eligible to participate.

The donation to provide one protective vest for a law enforcement K9 is \$950.00. Each vest has a value between \$1,744 – \$2,283, and a five-year warranty and an average weight of 4-5 lbs. There is an estimated 30,000 law enforcement K9s throughout the United States. For more information or to learn about volunteer opportunities, please call 508-824-6978. K9 Cannon and his handler, Officer Adam Marvin, hit the streets of Faribault in June of 2017. They have completed both basic canine and narcotics detection training through the St. Paul Police Department. The generous support of Faribault residents, businesses and other supporters helped fund the purchase of K9 Cannon. "We are grateful for the support of donors who helped provide this valuable resource for the community. We are especially thankful for the donor who funded the vest contribution which will help keep K9 Cannon safe", commented Chief Andy Bohlen.
