Replica Gun Encounter

On Tuesday, July 10th, an anonymous tipster sent information to us via TIP411 of a person seen with a handgun. The tipster provided a description and location of the person. The person with the gun had stated he carried the gun for personal protection. **Officers Sean Smallen** and **Adam Marvin** located the person a short time later. The handgun turned out to be a BB gun replica of a .357 revolver. The replica even had ".357" stamped on it. After determining no crime had been committed, the replica was

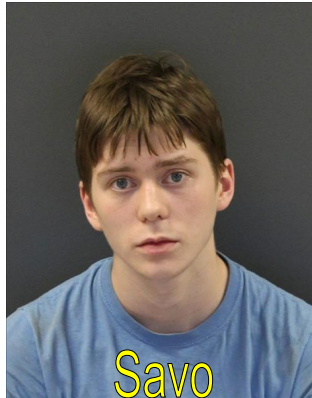


returned and the person was released.

While officers are aware of replicas such as this, suspected guns must be treated as real until determined to be otherwise. Fortunately, both the person and officers remained calm throughout this encounter and it was quickly resolved without incident. Too often, replica guns are displayed recklessly resulting in use of force encounters with bad outcomes for citizens and officers.

Tips Lead to Warrant Arrest

On Monday, July 9th, a tip was received via Tip411 of a person wanted in Alaska. The tipster provided an address for Tanner Savo, 19. Another caller told **Officer Chris Tonjum** that Savo's warrant was for a sex offense and she was concerned that a special needs child lived in the same residence. Ofc. Tonjum contacted the Alaska State Troopers to verify the warrant, and learned that they would extradite Savo if arrest-



ed. Ofc. Tonjum went to the residence and spoke with a resident who confirmed that Savo was present. Ofc. Tonjum arrested and jailed Savo without incident. Savo was charged with Fugitive From Justice and held pending extradition.
