Emergency Notification

Question ~ Do you know how Public Safety Agencies disseminate important safety information to the public? Everbridge

This system, Everbridge, allows Rice & Steele 911 Center to notify citizens of emergent situations that may affect area residents and allows citizens to be informed of time sensitive incidents as they arise. Rice and Steele Counties have offered Everbridge since 2012. This system will allow weather alerts to be disseminated directly from the National Weather Service, allows citizens to set a window of time for notifica-

tions, and to subscribe to which notifications they would like to receive.

Citizens can choose to receive messages through the following options: home phone, work phone, cell phone, email and SMS text messages. They can also choose to receive urgent notifications about events that may affect their home, workplace, family's schools and more.

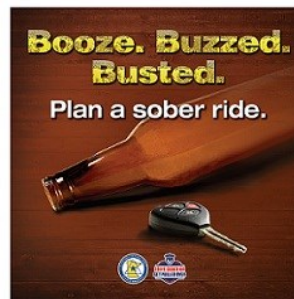

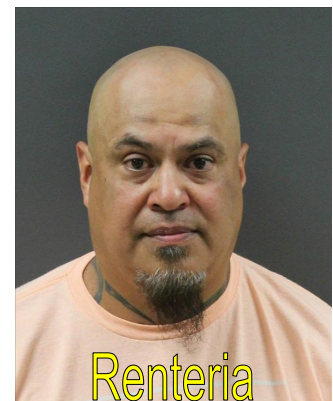

Domestic Assault Arrest

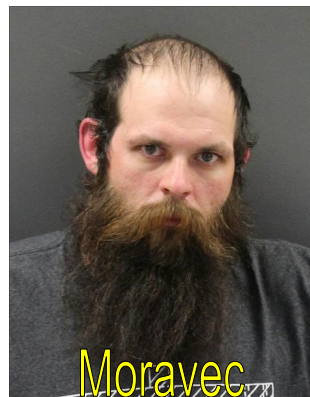
On Wednesday, August 28th, **Officers Jacob Holm, Sarah Tollefson and Matt Shuda** responded to a reported Order for Protection (OFP) violation. The victim reported her former boyfriend had entered her residence while she was sleeping, assaulted and threatened her. He then fled prior to officers’ arrival. The victim explained she had been granted an OFP, but it had not yet been served. Offic-

ers found the suspect, Steven Renteria, 52, a short distance away. He was arrested and jailed without incident. He was charged with Domestic Assault - felony, and his bail was set at



DWI Arrest

On Sunday, August 25th, officers responded to a report of a man trying to get into a residence. While en route, the caller reported that the suspect, Jacob Moravec, 31, had left driving a vehicle and was under the influence. **Officer Michael Shuda** saw the vehicle as he neared the residence. After observing the driving conduct, Ofc. Shuda stopped the vehicle and met with Moravec, who displayed



signs of intoxication. Ofc. Shuda administered field sobriety tests, which also indicated Moravec was intoxicated. He was taken to the jail and submitted to a breath test which indicated his blood-alcohol content was .20. He was charged with 2nd degree DWI and 5th degree Controlled Substances. He was released on his own recognizance by the court.
