## Welcome Aboard



## Warrant Arrest

On Wednesday, March 18th, as **Officer Spencer Angle** was entering a business he recognized a male leaving at the same time. Ofc. Angle recognized the male as Anthony Thomas, 39, and knew he was the subject of an arrest warrant. Ofc. Angle stopped him, and Thomas initially provided his brother's name. Ofc. Angle was also aware that Thomas has provided his brother's name in the past. After retrieving his identification, Ofc. Angle confirmed

that Tomas was the subject of six arrest warrants. He was arrested. During pat-down, Thomas stated he had a glass pipe secreted in his pants. At the jail, a glass methamphetamine pipe and baggie with suspected methamphetamine residue was recovered from Thomas' pants. In addition to the warrants, Thomas was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances.

## Camera Upgrade

This week, we upgraded our interview room camera system. The previous cameras were installed in 2009 when we moved in to our current building. The new system, by Axon, integrates with our body-worn and fleet cameras. Recordings will be categorized and stored in the same manner, making it easier to provide recordings to prosecutors. Utilizing cloud storage eliminates the need to record interviews on DVD. The number of cameras was also



increased, with each interview room now having two high-definition cameras to record interviews.
