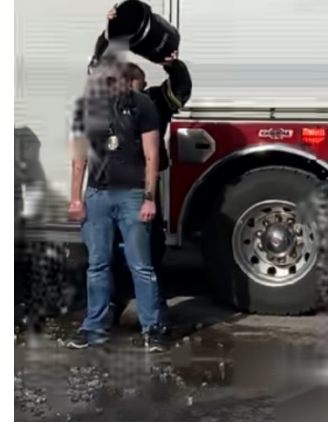

DWI Arrest

On Sunday, February 20th, **Officer Jacob Charlton, Lance Ulrich** and **Sergeant Brandon Gliem** responded to a disturbance. The caller reported that a female was ramming his truck with her car. As they arrived, Ofc. Ulrich saw the suspect vehicle and stopped it. The truck owner showed cell phone video of the suspect driving her car into the truck, and officers could see crash debris on the street. The car driver was identified as Justine Hansen, 28. She denied to officers that she hit the truck, and

that her car was damaged previously. Hansen displayed signs of intoxication. Ofc. Charlton administered field sobriety tests to Hansen, which indicated she was intoxicated. She was arrested. At the jail she submitted to a breath test which reported a .12 BAC. In a post-Miranda statement, Hansen stated she had been arguing with her boyfriend and was trying to leave after he assaulted her, and continued to deny hitting the truck. Hansen was charged with 1st degree Damage to Property and 2nd de-



gree DWI. Her bail was set at \$6,000 with conditions.

Recruitment
