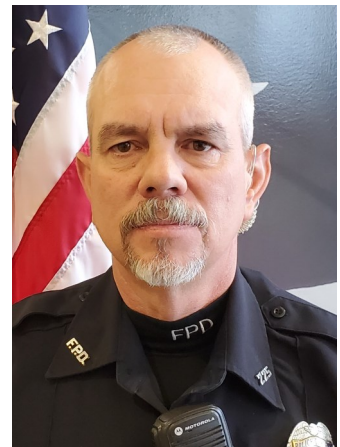

Burglary Bust

On Thursday, April 14th, **Officers Spencer Angle, Matt Kolling, Bill Considine, Val Esquivel, Sarah Tollefson, Sergeant Mark Krenik and Chief John Sherwin** responded to a report of suspicious persons. Ofc. Angle arrived first and met with a witness, who told him three males had parked a vehicle and walked through the alley. The witness did not recognize the males or the vehicle as belonging in the neighborhood. As they were talking, Ofc. Angle saw three males walking towards them and the witness identified them as the suspects. Two of the males were carrying TVs. The males ran when they saw Ofc. Angle, who pursued them on

foot. One of the males, Carlos Lopez, 18, stopped and Ofc. Angle could see that he was holding a handgun. Ofc. Angle gave him multiple verbal commands, and he eventually complied. Lopez was taken into custody without incident. Ofc. Considine also found a juvenile male who was stopped and questioned. **Detectives Tony Larson, Josh Sjodin and Sergeant Matt Long** and picked up the investigation, and determined Lopez had burglarized a nearby residence. Lopez was charged with Receiving Stolen Property, 2nd degree Burglary, Carrying a Pistol without a Permit, and Fleeing a Peace Officer on Foot. His bail was set at \$1,000 with condi-

tions. Detectives continue to work on the case to determine positively identify the two juvenile males also involved in the burglary.
